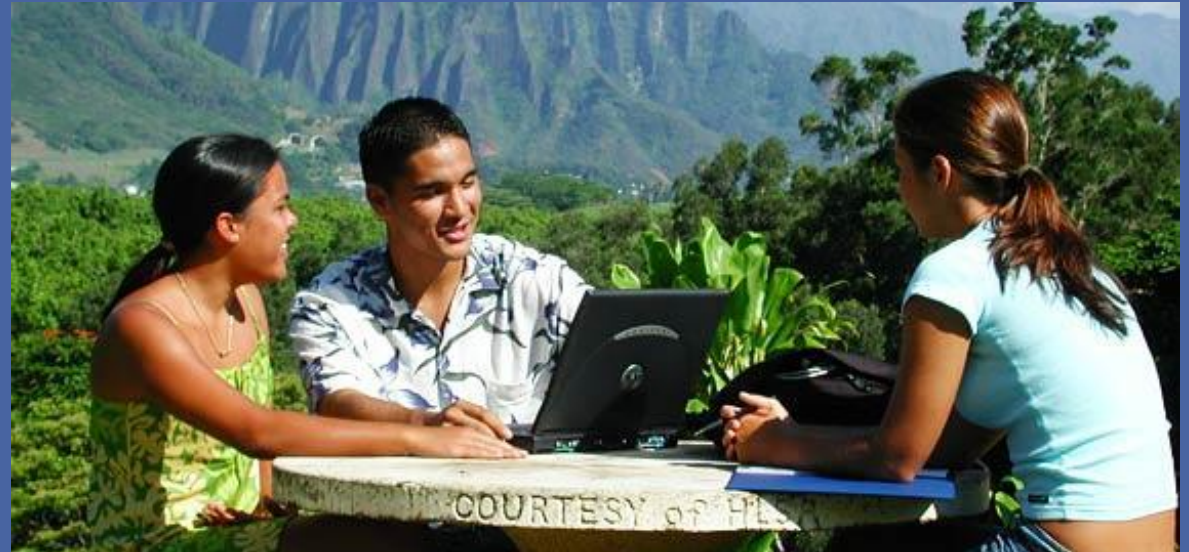

Academic Advisors will...

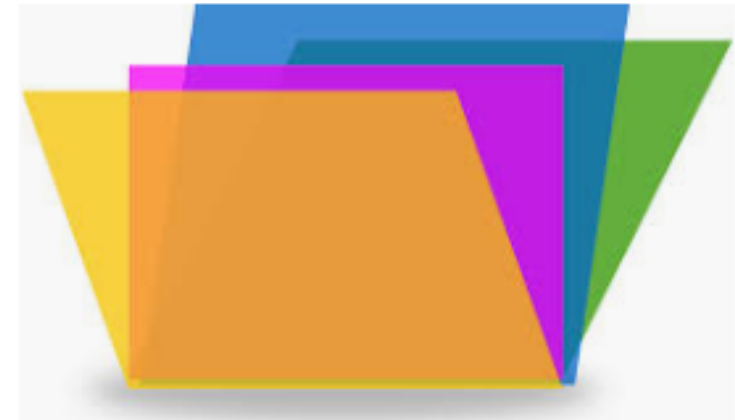
- Assist in developing a clear academic path toward degree completion.

Students should...


- Connect with your advisor every semester.
