Findings for RN Comprehensive Predictor

Summary of Findings: Individual Program Mean = 67.2% with an

adjusted group score of 73% Individual National Mean = 67.9%

83% of student scored above the program target

72% of students scored above ideal target

Safety was measured through 18 question items. The group score was 74.8% which equals 96%-97% chance of passing this content information on the NCLEX-RN. The National Group Mean was 64.5% and our Program Group Mean was 64.4%.
