An aggregated percentage at or above the competency benchmark is considered achievement of that competency. If the program has more than one program option, the program must report data for each program option, and also an aggregate of all program options combined to determine an overall percentage of students across all program options achieving the competency benchmark.

*ASSESSMENT MEASURE #1: **Social Work Assessment of Multicultural Practice (SWAMP)** items were written and developed by the HPU MSW faculty to best reflect the CSWE Student Learning Outcomes (SLOs) taught within the MSW course curriculum content delivered within Foundation year courses. The SWAMP was written during academic year 2019- 2020, and finalized into 62 items in April 2020. Students sat for the closed-book exam during their final exam period for SWRK 6201 (HBSE II) for 3 hours (Spring 2021), and Advanced Standing MSW students took the SWAMP as their final exam after completing SWRK 6050 "Bridge Course" (early August 2020). During the 2020-2021 academic year 26 students completed the SWAMP.
